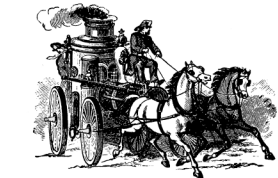

Safe work in a healthy environment has been the law of the land for fifty-two years. Every April 28th we continue to mourn those lives stolen by workplace hazards employers refuse to eliminate, abate or otherwise protect workers from. All too often it is also having a devastating effect on the community. On many levels. We are hearing on a near daily basis of emergent ecologic disaster caused by corporate bean counters not understanding – nor being required to – the reasons for safety regulations and their requirements and how that affects worker health or safety.

In the three years since the start of the SARS-CoV-2/COVID-19 pandemic not a single worker has been recognized as having died due to the virus. On a daily, weekly, monthly and yearly basis we saw thousands of workers dying from COVID-19. We saw hospital Emergency Rooms over flow with COVID-19 patients. Workers were deemed “essential” and forced to continue going to work without adequate protection, training or protection. Many employers refused to provide information, training or appropriate personal protective equipment.

Every year **WisCOSH** compiles a list of workers known to have died due to workplace incident and exposure. Every year we know it is incomplete. If you can provide more information about a work-related death **WisCOSH** would be grateful if you would send it to wmd2023@wiscosh.org.

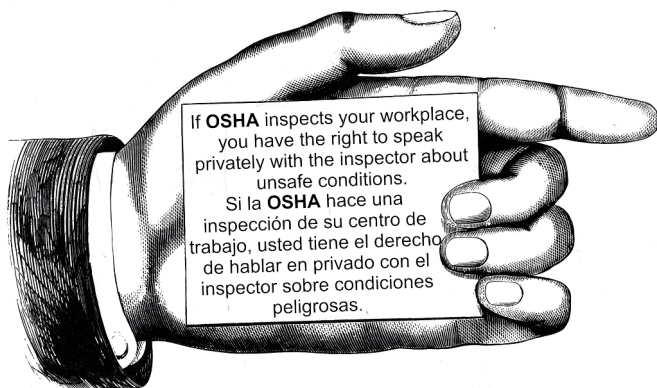

Letter From The Board of Directors

Issues of worker health and safety continue to be of great importance. Many employers fail to put workers' safety before profits. These employers' actions require workers to learn safe work procedures and their rights under **OSHA** on their own.

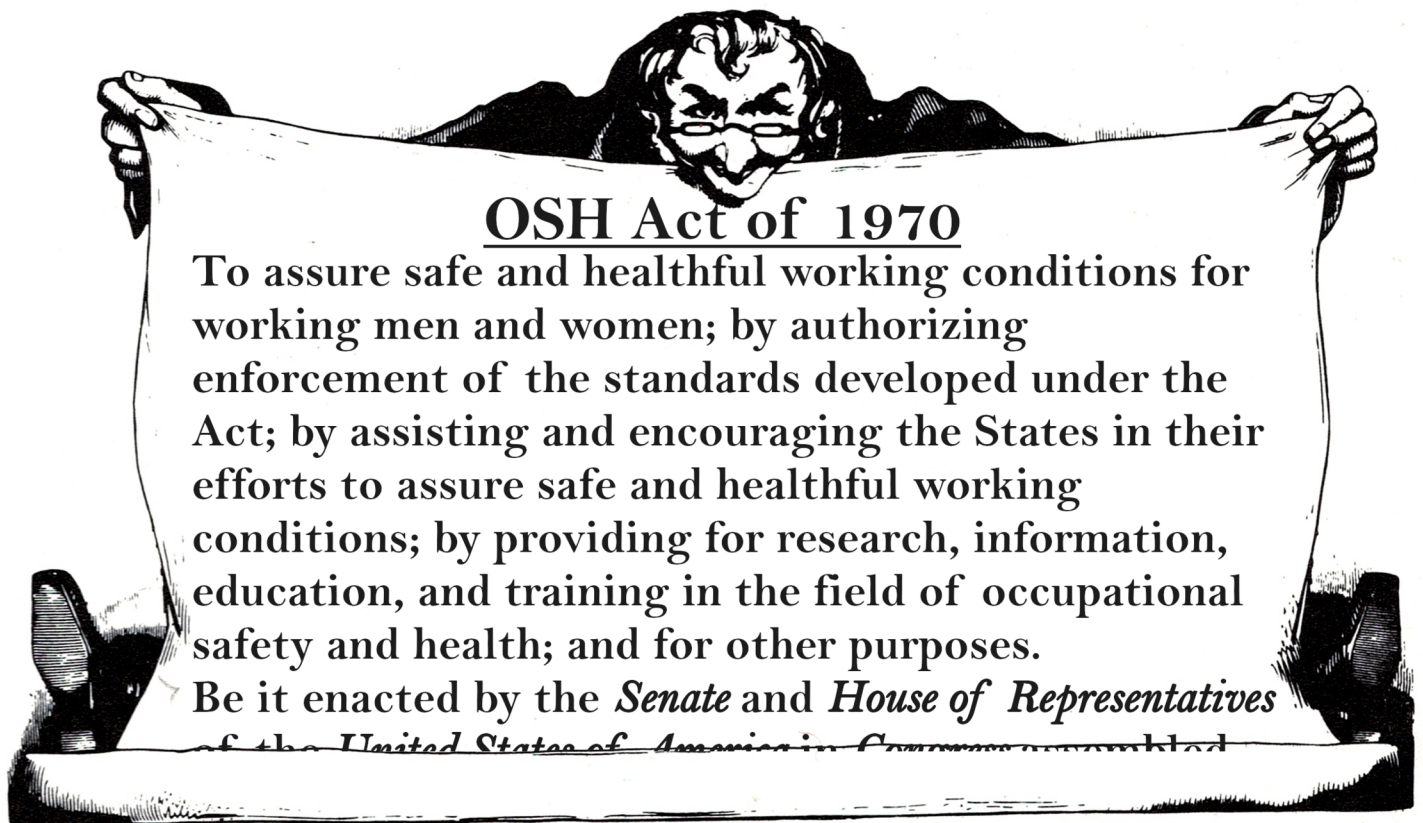
Knowledge of your rights and the hazards of your occupation may mean the difference between an injury or illness and not going home at the end of shift. Many workers have discovered that Worker Compensation fails to be a good method for recovering from the injuries from workplace incidents. Therefore, the best method is to stop the injury before it occurs.

While there are many factors that increase your chance of injury these are some of the most likely:

- 1) Failure of the employer to provide safety and/or health training
- 2) Lack of breaks from hazardous job assignments
- 3) Lack of appropriate safety equipment on the job
- 4) Understaffed workforce
- 5) No contract language for the right to refuse job activities that are too hazardous to perform

With all these factors, you may believe you have no chance to reduce the possibility of injury to you on the job. However, the solution to your problem is to work with your co-workers, your union (if you have one), as well as a good contract and **WisCOSH**. Your involvement in the Union provides the good contract and training in the workplace. **WisCOSH** also provides training for you and safety committees on safe work procedures and your rights under **OSHA**. **WisCOSH** is here for all workers in the state of Wisconsin.

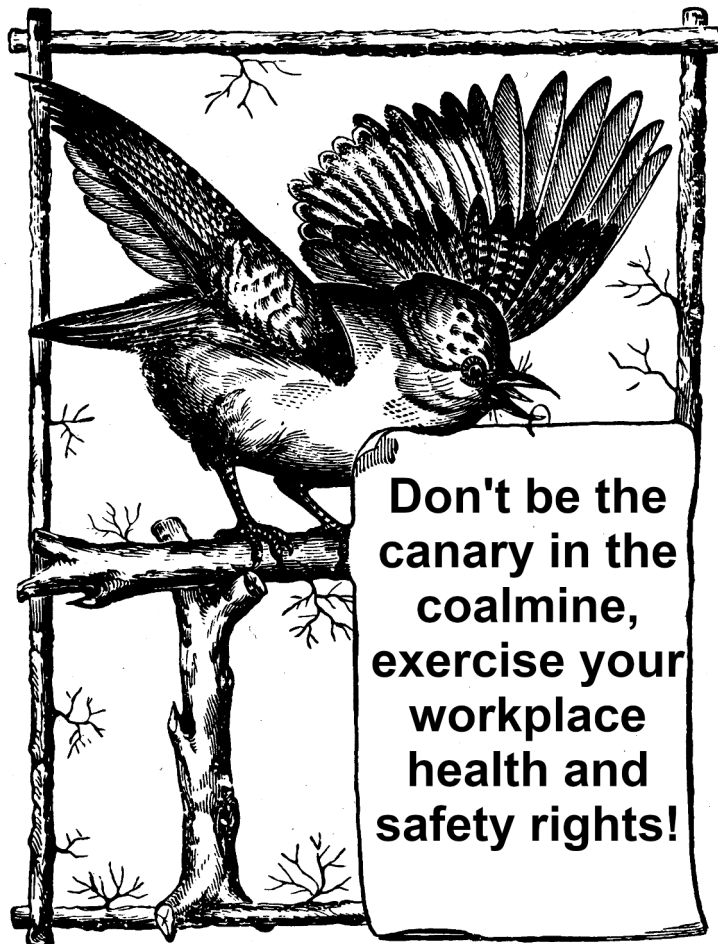

If You're Hurt On The Job ...

1. Inform a witness or someone nearby at the time of the incident
2. Inform your boss
3. If you have a union inform your representative or stewards
4. Seek medical attention immediately

DO NOT:

- Drive yourself to the doctor, clinic or hospital
- Allow your boss or coworker to drive you to the doctor or hospital
- Let your employer send you in a taxi, Uber or Lyft to get medical attention
- Leave the workplace until qualified medical help arrives

DO:

- Call an ambulance and remain inside the workplace until the medics transport you out
- File a Workers Compensation Claim as soon as possible
- See your own doctor as soon as possible
- Inform your doctor you are seeing them about a workplace injury
- Take a witness with you to all medical appointments
- Take a witness with you to all meetings with the employer

If you do not have a union **WisCOSH** is able to assist you.

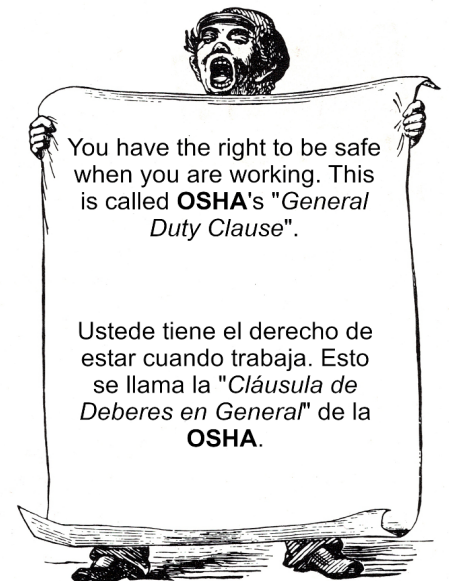

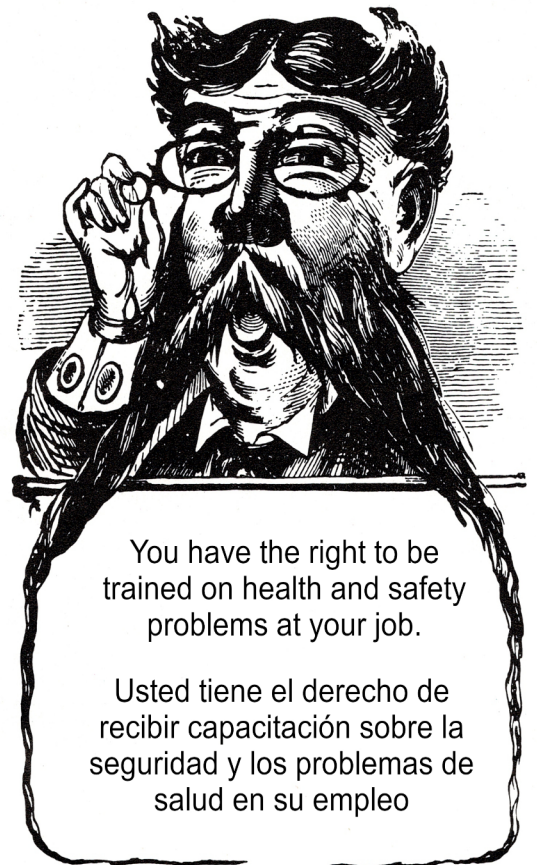
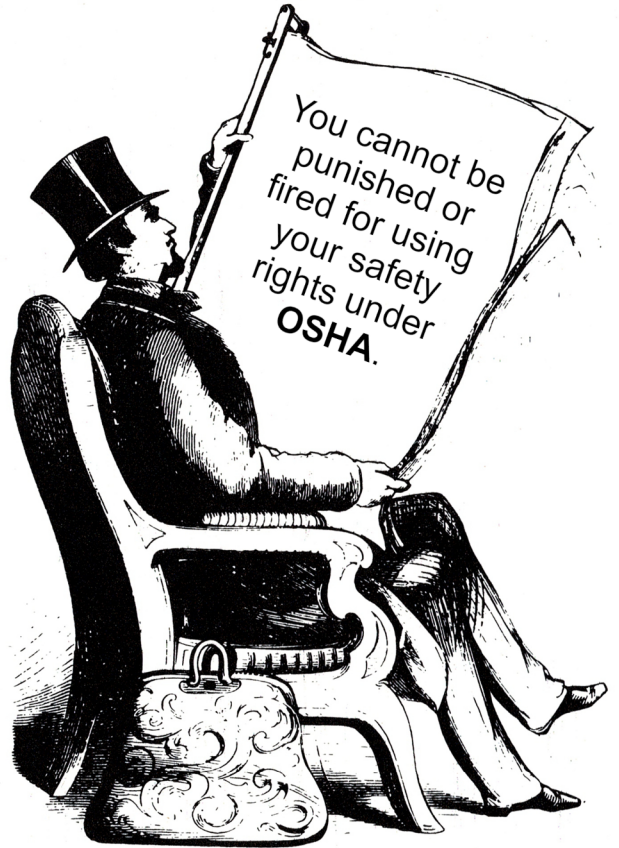
